Sawer Creek Lock 25 Concrete Work to Begin

Trent-Severn Waterway National Historic Site

Peterborough, Ontario, November 2, 2016 - During the week of November 7th, 2016, Parks Canada will begin concrete repair work at Sawer Creek Lock 25 on the Trent-Severn Waterway National Historic Site.

The construction contract for this project was recently awarded to Greyleith Limited. They will be setting up on site during the week of November 7th, 2016. The following week they will focus on installing a cofferdam to create a dry work area around the lock.

The repairs will include concrete repairs to the lock chamber and replacement of the lower lock entrance walls to ensure continued structural integrity and functionality of the lock. Work is scheduled to be completed by May 2017.

This project is part of Parks Canada's unprecedented \$3 billion dollar investment over 5 years to support infrastructure work to heritage, visitor, waterway and highway assets located within national historic sites, national parks, and national marine conservation areas across Canada. These historic investments will mitigate health and safety risks, halt the loss of nationally significant built heritage and stimulate the economy in communities across the country.

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
