## 3. PICNIC TABLES



## Go back toward the fort and stop at the brown picnic tables.

The fort served different countries and purposes over time. Use the information on the tables to match the years with an event.

1709	Fort Chambly becomes <b>British</b> .
1760	The French build a stone fort.
1775	Patriotes Uprisings: Some subjects refuse to be under British control.
1812	<b>War between the United States</b> and <b>Great Britain.</b> A military base camp is built in the park.
1837	Fort Chambly becomes American!




## 5. THE FORT: DEFENCE SYSTEM

**Observe the fort.** What is the name of a fort's **corner**?

#### 6. COPPER REDHORSE

Go to the big sign near the river. Do not go down to the water.



The copper redhorse is an endangered species of fish. Every year from late June to early July it comes to spawn here in the rapids.

## 7. TONGUE TWISTER

#### 8. MOUNTAIN

Walk to the black fence overlooking the water in front of the fort.

#### 9. MONUMENT



Head toward the P1 parking lot (where your bus is), but do not cross the bridge. Turn right toward the cement monument.

#### 10. TREES

Head back toward the fort and turn right on the small trail at the first intersection. Walk slowly and open your eyes wide!

#### Find the name of the trees which commemorate:

Mr Joseph-Octave Dion, first curator of Fort Chambly
 Gilles T. Sénécal, lock-keeper at Chambly Canal
 300<sup>th</sup> anniversary of the Laprairie battle

Do not walk past the benches. Turn left at the intersection.

#### 11. FORMER STOCKADE



Head toward the fort's chapel and look for the logs on the ground.

They represent the location of a stockade from 2<sup>nd</sup> wooden fort!

Jump from one log to another toward the entrance door!

#### 12. ENTRANCE DOOR

**Look at the entrance door.** If you were to engrave **names** around the front door of your house, **which ones would you choose**?
