GENERAL CONDITIONS

1. The Canada National Parks Act, and Regulations made pursuant to the Act apply. It is the responsibility of the permit holder to abide by all other applicable Provincial and Federal statutes. Failure to follow the conditions of a permit may result in prosecution.
2. The permit holder must carry a copy of this permit and be prepared to identify themselves and produce it upon request from a Park Warden, Parks Canada Staff member or Peace Officer.
3. This permit may be cancelled at any time by written or verbal notice.
4. This permit is valid only for the dates, locations and activities shown.
5. This permit is not transferrable.
6. For Fire Permits, all fires must be kept under control and supervised at all times.
7. For Overweight Vehicle Permits, the permit is for servicing destinations along the Icefields Parkway (93N) between the Town of Jasper and the Columbia Icefield and does not allow through travel to Highway 11 or the Trans-Canada Highway #1.
8. Notwithstanding any other provisions of this permit, the permittee shall indemnify Parks Canada from any and all liabilities, costs, damages, claims, suits or actions arising from: a) any damage to property; or b) any injury to a person or persons including death occasioned by the permittee in his/her use, occupation or by his/her activities resulting from this permit.
