



H.J. Moberly Bridge (Maligne Lake Rd.) Restricted Activity Permit Application

Background

The H.J. Moberly Bridge on Maligne Lake Road is the sole public access point for reaching any destinations along or beyond Maligne Lake Road.

Moberly Bridge has the following weight limits:

- Vehicle weight limit for one truck or bus on the bridge at a time:
 - Single unit vehicle: maximum 17,000 kg
 - Tractor trailer: maximum 22,000 kg
 - Vehicle train: maximum 43,000 kg

Loads exceeding the maximum limits specified above or otherwise classified as oversize or overweight under the Commercial Vehicle Dimension and Weight Regulation (AR 315/2002) of Alberta, require a Restricted Activity Permit (RAP) to cross Moberly Bridge.

Oversize vehicles applying for a permit should be no larger than the following limits of the bridge:

- Height limit of 4.80m.
- Width limit of 5.80m.

Special load configurations or crossing procedures may be considered. Applicants are encouraged to include any supporting information with their submission for review.

To reduce public impact, applicants may be obligated to travel during off-peak or nighttime hours.

All hauling and traffic control companies involved in crossing Moberly Bridge, require a valid Parks Canada business license.

A temporary closure of the bridge, managed by qualified traffic control personnel, is required, and is the permit holder's responsibility.

Permits can be issued on an annual basis. All annual permits expire on March 31.

Complete applications will be reviewed, and a response provided within five (5) business days.

General Conditions

1. The National Parks Act and Regulations apply. Failure to follow conditions of permit may result in prosecution.
2. The permit must be carried by the permit holder and shown to a Park Warden, Park Staff or Peace Officer on demand.
3. This permit may be cancelled at any time by written or verbal notice.
4. This permit is valid only for the vehicle, company, dates and locations shown.
5. This permit is not transferrable.
6. Notwithstanding any other provisions of this permit, the permittee shall indemnify Parks Canada from any and all liabilities, costs, damages, claims, suits or actions arising from:
 - a) any damage to property; or
 - b) any injury to a person or persons including death occasioned by the permittee in his/her use, occupation or by his/her activities resulting from this permit.

Specific Conditions

1. This permit authorizes crossing of Moberly Bridge only. It does not allow travel elsewhere within Jasper National Park, including on Highway 93 or over any other bridge with posted load restrictions
2. Vehicles that are oversize or overweight under Alberta law, as defined in the Commercial Vehicle Dimension and Weight Regulation (AR 315/2002) under the Traffic Safety Act, must obtain approval through the TRAVIS Permit System (including Jasper National Park) in addition to this Restricted Activity Permit, before any vehicle may cross the bridge.
3. Permitted vehicles must cross the bridge in a single-lane configuration; no other vehicles may be on the bridge at the same time. A temporary closure of the bridge, managed by qualified traffic control personnel, is required, and is the permit holder's responsibility.
4. The maximum permitted speed when crossing the bridge is 10 km/h.

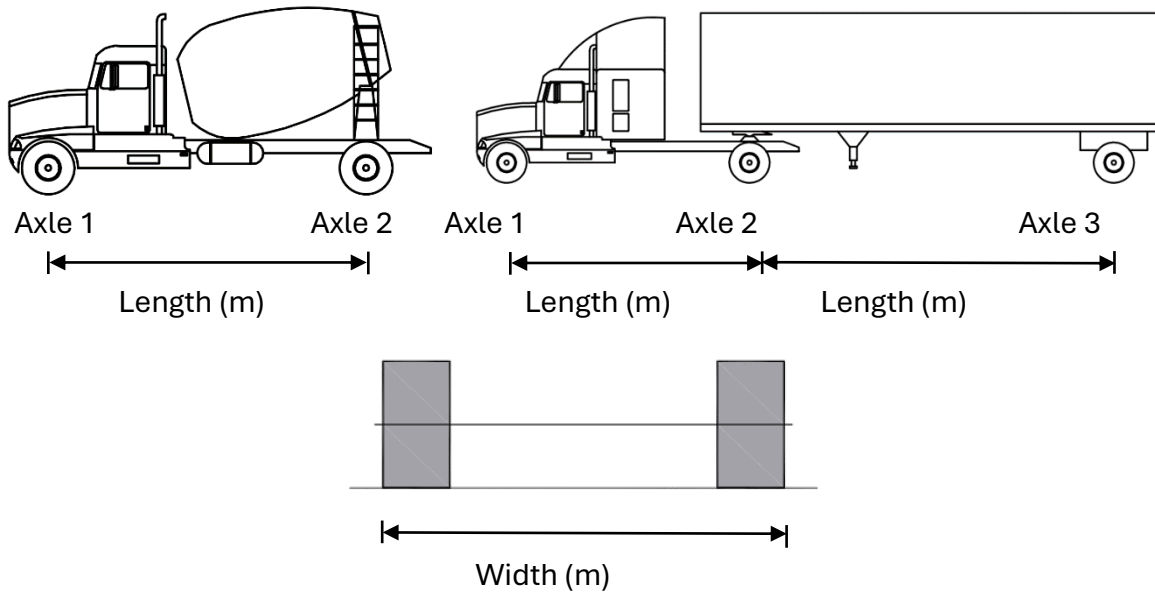
