What is a Management Plan?

For 100 years, Parks Canada has been managing national parks on behalf of Canadians.

A Management Plan is a forward-looking document that provides strategic direction and desired outcomes to guide and assist park staff in decision-making.

The Management Plan sets out:

 a vision of what the park should be like in 15 years time;

- overarching management principles
- 15-year objectives for all aspects of the national park mandate
- priority actions, for the first 5 years, to address management needs and issues
- strategic management direction that will be used to ensure visitors can experience and enjoy the national park while ensuring

that adequate protection of natural and cultural heritage occurs

 Strategic direction regarding how Parks Canada will engage the public.

The Management Plan provides a commitment to the public regarding how the park will be managed.

How Will the Management Plan be Developed?

National Park Management Plans are developed with input and involvement from interested Canadians. Some of the groups that will be involved in this management planning process include:

- Park Advisory Board
- First Nations-Parks
 Canada Committees
- Interested Coast Salish First Nations
- Local and regional residents
- Other stakeholders (business licensees, non -government organizations, local groups, user groups)
- Park staff
- Key government agencies
- Other interested Canadians

To ensure the public has many opportunities to become involved and provide input and ideas, a phased approach will be used to develop the first Management Plan for Gulf Islands National Park Reserve.

Phase 1, beginning in the June 2011, will focus on engaging people in discussion and getting suggestions so we can update the park vision, update the overall management principles, and establish 15-year objectives for strategic areas of focus.

Phase 2, which is anticipated to be undertaken in Spring 2012, will focus on establishing realistic 5-year targets and 5-year priority actions, setting direction for park administration and

operations and partnering and public engagement.

Phase 3, which is likely to begin in Fall 2012, will focus largely on park zoning and monitoring.

Phase 4, will consist of a public review and comment period—allowing people to consider the draft Management Plan as a whole document.

Once final changes have been made to the Management Plan, based on comments received, information will be provided to explain any significant changes made.

Phase 5, Chief Executive Officer's and Minister's approvals and tabling of the Management Plan in Parliament.
