# Prevent the spread

**In Riding Mountain National Park, you must:**

- **CLEAN, DRAIN, DRY** all watercraft and equipment before launching.
- **DECONTAMINATE** watercraft and equipment used in Clear Lake before launching **outside Riding Mountain National Park.**

## Permits

You need a permit to use:

- Watercraft
- Towables
- Wet and dry suits
- Diving gear
- Inflatables that carry more than one person



Proceed to the Boat Cove in Wasagaming for a permit.



Open 8:30 am to 8:30 pm daily.



The boat launch gates are locked when the inspection station is closed.





# One boat, one lake

A **one-boat, one-lake** approach helps prevent the spread of invasive species.

## Outlying Lakes Permit (non-motorized only)



- Valid for all lakes and rivers in the park **except Clear Lake**.
- You may move between park waters, but you must **Clean, Drain, Dry** before you launch in a different lake or river.

## Clear Lake Permit (motorized or non-motorized)



- Valid **only** for Clear Lake.
- You cannot use a boat or equipment that was used in Clear Lake **in any other park waters**.
- No-wake zone 150 metres from shore.
- No motors on Mondays and Tuesdays or overnight from 8:30 pm to 8:30 am.

Motors and trailered boats are only permitted on Clear Lake. Parks Canada staff must:

- Lock the boat to its trailer with a tag each time it leaves the water
- Unlock this tag before each launch



Starting June 8, or if you used your motorized or trailered boat in 2026, you must get it tagged and then complete a 45-day quarantine **before launching in Clear Lake**.
