



TRAILS NOT REQUIRING A GUIDED BUSINESS LICENCE IN THE MOUNTAIN NATIONAL PARKS OF CANADA

The following list of trails and areas primarily consists of short, hardened trails to front-country attractions commonly used by the motor tour industry. Use of these trails do not require a Guided Business Licence as they were designed for high levels of use. These areas may be used by groups larger than those specified under the outdoor guiding categories. Park staff will recommend these areas to larger groups such as school groups to avoid congestion on single-file hiking trails. Any business accessing the trails listed below, with clients, is required to have a Basic Business Licence in the Mountain National Parks, however any trails not listed below require your company to obtain a Guided Business Licence.

To prevent damage to vegetation and ensure your safety, stay on designated trails at all times.

Whether a company sends an employee with the group or drops them at the trailhead, they are in a position of trust and have a responsibility for the group's safety.

Parks Canada reserves the right to make adjustments to this list as needed in response to changing circumstances, environmental considerations and assessments, public safety and other operational requirements and considerations.

Annex I

Vehicle Size Restrictions in Jasper National Park

Road Location	Vehicle Length Restriction	Additional Details and Information
Lake Annette Road	9 metres (30 feet)	Includes adjoining parking areas for Lake Annette and Lake Edith.
Lake Edith Drive	6 metres (20 feet)	Not suitable for large vehicles or for tour operations.
Pyramid Beach Road	7.5 metres (25 feet)	Road is very narrow with limited large vehicle parking and small turn around area.
Pyramid Road	7.5 metres (25 feet)	From Pyramid Lake Resort to the end of the road, including Pyramid Island. Very small challenging turn around and limited parking at end of road. <i>Restriction applies 11:00 to 17:00 daily.</i>
Old Fort Point Road	6 metres (20 feet)	Access to Lac Beauvert, from Old Fort Point Trailhead (P1) to Lac Beauvert (P18).
Sunwapta Falls Access Road	N/A	Includes parking lot. Not recommended for large vehicle due to narrow access road and lack of parking.
Toe of the Glacier Road	7.5 metres (25 feet)	Includes parking lot.
Wilcox Pass Trailhead	7.5 metres (25 feet)	Includes parking lot.
Celestine Lake Road	6 metres (20 feet)	Road is a rough one-way gravel road with sharp corners. High clearance vehicles recommended.
Miette Road	7.5 metres (25 feet)	Road is narrow and winding with sharp corners. Trailer drop-off available at Lower Miette Mine Trail parking lot.
