NEW Big Canoe, Big Sky: Paddle amongst the stars on Kejimikujik Lake. In the big canoe, with skilled and experienced guides, you will journey between worlds at the heart of this special place. Under the night sky, reflected in the lake, you will hear the stories that tie the two together. Location: Jakes Landing. Cost: \$14.50/person. Registration Required.

Big Lake, Big Canoe, Guided Paddle: Paddle a giant 38-foot Mi'kmaw-style canoe out into Kejimikujik Lake. This unique experience merges an active paddling adventure with intriguing morsels of cultural and natural history. With skilled and talented guides at the helm, you'll safely paddle in amongst the islands that dot Kejimikujik Lake. Location: Jakes Landing. Cost: \$14.50/person. Registration Required.

Birch Bark Canoe-Building: Witness the ancient craft of birch bark canoe-building in person with Todd Labrador and family at work right before your eyes. Public demonstrations offer a 'drop-in' Mi'kmaw cultural experience. All ages welcome. *Pets allowed. Dates: Thursday through Sunday from 12:30-3:30pm in July and August. Location: Merrymakedge P4 (end of beach area). Cost: Free

Creature Feature: Visit the Interpreters at the beach and discover some of the amazing creatures that live at Kejimikujik, such as birds, reptiles, mammals, insects, and fish. Different flora and fauna will be featured throughout the summer! Location: Merrymakedge Beach (P4). Cost: Free. *Pets allowed.

Experience the Petroglyphs: Join a Parks Canada Interpreter and learn about Mi'kmaw culture by experiencing the wonder of the petroglyphs on the shores of Kejimikujik Lake. Registration required. This program is cancelled if it is raining. No pets. Not recommended for young children. Location: Merrymakedge P1. Cost: Free. Registration Required.

NEW Keji Coffee: Start your day at Kejimikujik with coffee and comradery – bike, walk or paddle to a beautiful location, make coffee and hang out with other campers and staff. You can bring your coffee in a thermos or make it fresh and hot on your backpacking stove, then greet the day with a Parks Canada Interpreter and learn about what is new and happening in Kejimikujik. Location: Various check poster for Keji Coffee. *Pets allowed.

NEW Kejimikujik Adventures – “Open Mic” Storytelling Program with Prizes: We know you've all had incredible adventures at Kejimikujik and we want to hear them! Join our Interpreters in an “Open Mic” session at the Lakeview Eatery. Share your funny and/or awe-inspiring stories of Kejimikujik adventures and have a chance at winning the coveted “Keji Adventurer” prize and bragging rights for the week! Location: Lakeview Café & Eatery. Cost: Free. *Pets allowed.

Knowing Nature Guided Hikes: Explore and experience the diversity of wild flora and fauna found along various trails at Kejimikujik. Travel from one ecosystem to the next, with your guide, and learn to identify the natural world around you! Location: Various. Cost: Free. *Pets allowed.

Mersey Magic Voyager Canoe Paddle: Slow down to the flow of the river as you dip your paddle into the dark waters of the Mersey and get the inside scoop on all things Kejimikujik! Your personal guides are treasure troves of essential natural and cultural history knowledge and may even share a humorous story or two as they serve you a delicious treat and refreshing Mersey Tea. Location: Jakes Landing. Cost: \$14.50/person. Registration Required.

Mi'kmaw Encampment - Wejisqalia'ti'k: Wejisqalia'ti'k means: “We grew up from the earth”. For the Mi'kmaq this word incorporates thousands of years living and respecting their homeland, Mi'kma'ki. Cultivate your connection with the teachings that nature offers while a Cultural Interpreter shares their unique skills and knowledge of this land. All ages welcome. *Pets allowed. Location: Merrymakedge P2. Cost: Free.

NEW Night Hike in the Old-Growth Forest: Explore the deep dark secrets of an old-growth forest at night. With a nocturnal-naturalist at your side, you will experience the woods in a whole new way, employing all your senses to navigate and investigate the Hemlocks and Hardwoods Trail. Along the way you will also learn about the little bug attacking the hemlocks and Parks Canada's efforts to save these towering giants. Location: Hardwoods and Hemlocks trailhead. Cost: Free. Registration Required.

Petroglyphs Paddle: Paddle together in a BIG canoe with your guides out onto Kejimikujik Lake into a restricted petroglyph site. Here you can see, touch and feel the petroglyph carvings and feel the presence of the Mi'kmaq, since time immemorial, on this cultural landscape. Location: Jakes Landing. Cost: \$14.50/person. Registration Required.

Plant a Tree, Save a Forest: Join Parks Canada Interpreters and Ecologists and put down roots by planting your own tree(s). Your helping hands will increase the biodiversity of the Jeremy's Bay Campground forest and improve its resiliency against climate change events and invasive species infestations. Location: Jeremy's Bay Campground. Cost: Free.

Kejimikujik Campfire Experience: Stories and connections are an essential part of the Kejimikujik camping experience. Cozy up next some flickering flames and be immersed in stories, songs, games, trivia, activities, and theatre, led by dazzling Parks Canada's Interpreters (and visitors)! A timeless tradition is captured here, around a campfire in the heart of Kejimikujik. Location: Jeremy's Bay Campground, Campfire Circle P2. Cost: Free. *Pets allowed.

Stories of the Stars: For years, humans have been inexplicably drawn to the mystery and beauty of the stars. Our ancestors embedded the fabric of their beliefs and culture into the sky by projecting their heroes and symbols onto stars and made the very first constellations. Join our dark-sky guides to hear some of the intricate stories behind these stars and constellations. Location: Jeremy's Bay Campground, Sky Circle P1. Cost: Free. *Pets allowed.
