- Camping permit is mandatory.
- Opening season: June 16 to September 5 However, Baie de Quarry Ouest campground is opened from June 9 to September 30. It may be possible to camp before and after these dates. Contact our Reception and Interpretation Centres.
- There are outhouses and a wood shelter near the campsites. Firewood is supplied.
- There are no restaurants on the islands and drinking water is not provided.

CAMPGROUND

Campsites are equipped with a tent platform, a picnic table and a cooking fireplace.

OTENTIK TENT

Enjoy a furnished, heated and lit accommodation, a cross between a tent and a rustic cabin. Built on a raised floor and attached to a small patio, the oTENTik tent can accommodate up to 6 people. Each tent is also equipped with a barbecue with a side burner (propane included), a picnic table, a cooking fireplace and camping chairs.

ÔASIS ACCOMMODATION

Enjoy a furnished, heated and lit teardrop-shaped 'duplex' equipped with a convertible table/bed on the main level that can accommodate two adults (maximum) as well as a suspended hammock loft above, perfect for two children or one adult (maximum 180 kg). Each site is equipped with a barbecue with a side burner (propane included), a picninc table, a cooking fireplace and camping chairs.

GROUP CAMPING

On Île du Havre, in Anse des Noyés, there are two campsites especially designed for groups. Each site can accommodate 12 to 25 people and is equipped with picnic tables, a cooking fireplace and three tent platforms.

If campers do not return at the expected time, voluntarily or otherwise, applicable fees for site rental and daily admission will be charged upon their arrival, based on the length of their extended stay.

BEFORE YOU LEAVE

- > Book your trip with a boat operator recognized by Parks Canada to plan your access to the islands (additionnal fees apply).
- > Confirm your departure time to the islands with your boat operator.
- Visit one of our Reception and Interpretation Centres at least one hour prior to your departure to get your camping permit (mandatory).
- Arrive at the place of boarding at least 30 to 45 minutes prior to your departure time.
- Make sure you know when and where the boat will pick you up on the day of your return to the mainland.

FOR AN OPTIMAL EXPERIENCE, DON'T FORGET TO BRING:

- Food and drinking water for at least two extra days (we recommend 2 litres per day per person).
- Your kitchenware, cutlery and dishes.
- > A good sleeping bag, warm waterproof clothes and hiking boots.
- A small axe and some matches.
- > An adequate communication device and a first aid kit.

4-STAR ACCOMMODATION IN A LIGHTHOUSE

Treat yourself to an eco-friendly overnight stay at Auberge de l'île aux Perroquets. Tuck in for the night in one of the two lightstation houses.

FOR YOUR SAFETY

Hiking along the shoreline is a great way to explore the Mingan Archipelago, but please, be aware of the following risks:



Falling rocks are a hazard near the cliffs. When possible, keep a safe distance, avoid walking beneath overhanging rocks and do not stop at the base of cliffs. Hike around low tide to stay away from the cliffs. Even with these precautions, be aware that falling rocks may sometimes be unavoidable and dangerous.



Please proceed with caution. Some areas along the shoreline may present difficult walking conditions and may cause you to fall. At low tide, water and seaweed on the rocks create slippery conditions. Hiking along the shoreline can be difficult at high tide as water may block the trail.



Admire the rock formations from the trails or the coastline. Climbing on the monoliths is dangerous and prohibited.

The Mingan Archipelago National Park Reserve is only accessible by boat.

The boat operators mentioned in this brochure provide a variety of transportation services to the islands. These companies are committed to providing quality services that respect Parks Canada's entire mandate.

It is strongly recommended that you contact these service providers for more information or to make reservations. A minimum number of passengers is required for the trips to take place.

Note: The islands are accessible by personal watercraft. However, it is prohibited to access the park with private boat operators who do not hold a business license issued by Parks Canada.

NOTICE

Some contractors offer activities outside of the park. These activities, including navigation around the park, are the sole responsibility of the contractors concerned.

Parks Canada is not responsible for accidents or incidents that may occur during activities outside the park boundaries.

Contact the boat operator to learn more about maritime conditions before your departure (recommended).

PRACTICING NAUTICAL ACTIVITIES BY YOURSELF? - BE INFORMED!

Before setting out to enjoy sea activities in the archipelago, make sure you have all the equipment and information you need. This will contribute to your safety and enhance your experience.

- Make sure you have an adequate communication device. Mobile phone coverage is limited in the park.
- Visit the slgo.ca website to view the "Mingan Atlas of Currents" (ocean currents around the Mingan islands).
- Ask about the mandatory equipment that you need to bring for your sea expedition.
- Get the tide tables and topographic maps from our Reception and Interpretation Centres.
- Visit charts.gc.ca to get nautical charts.
- Make sure you know the other specificities related to navigating in the archipelago.

A CONSERVATION TEAM DEDICATED TO THE PROTECTION OF NATURAL AND CULTURAL RESOURCES

MINGAN THISTLE

The Mingan thistle, an endangered species in Canada, is the core of conservation efforts at Mingan Archipelago National Park Reserve. Between 2017 and 2021, conservation actions were intensified: more than 11,000 seeds and 500 seedlings were transplanted, in addition to numerous interventions aimed at restoring its habitat. Although the population has grown from 444 plants in 2017 to 3,652 individuals in 2021, the species remains in a precarious situation today. In 2025, the conservation team will embark on a second phase of intervention, scheduled to run until 2028, the main objectives of which will be to restore damaged habitats and preserve the species' genetic diversity.

The Jardin Virginia, located near the Havre-Saint-Pierre marina, offers a unique opportunity to observe this rare thistle and learn more about its history and beauty.

STUDYING INSECT BIODIVERSITY

A decline in insect populations has been observed worldwide for almost twenty years, but remains poorly documented in Quebec and Canada. In collaboration with the Canadian Forest Service, ten national parks in eastern Canada, including the Mingan Archipelago, have been participating since 2023 in a study aimed at filling this gap. "Malaise" traps, installed along the Île Quarry trail, will again capture insects throughout the summer of 2025. Samples will be analyzed in the laboratory using DNA extraction techniques. The data collected between 2023 and 2025 will document the inter-annual variation in insect populations and detect any long-term changes by comparing them with the results of an inventory carried out in 2012 in the same parks.

The current epidemic of spruce budworm and hemlock looper, which has been raging in the archipelago for several years, will inevitably transform the islands' forest landscape.

COMMON EIDER AND GULL MONITORING ON THE BARRENS

The park reserve is home to large populations of common eiders and herring and great black-backed gulls, whose nesting on the barrens reflects the health of the ecosystem. An inventory carried out every ten years, from Île aux Perroquets to Île à la Chasse, tracks the evolution of these species. In 2015, over 3,000 eider nests and almost 2,000 gull nests were counted. The results of this monitoring suggest that eider populations nesting in the archipelago are doing well and increasing over time. However, herring and great black-backed gull populations have been in steady decline since 1990. The 2025 survey, led by the conservation team, will document variations in nesting populations, likely to be influenced by a variety of environmental factors, including predation, food availability and climate change.

THANK YOU FOR RESPECTING THIS FRAGILE AREA:

- > Use only established trails, keep to areas with no vegetation when walking along the coastline.
- Respect the Code of Ethics for Seabird Observation and Navigation in the Mingan Archipelago.
- > Make sure to read and obey park regulations.
- > Bring your garbage back with you after your stay in the park.
- Do not feed the wildlife.
- Leave your drone at home.



PRESENCE OF SURVEILLANCE CAMERAS

Surveillance cameras are used in this national park reserve for wildlife conservation purposes. Are you concerned about protecting your privacy? We are too. That's why we delete visitor images taken by our cameras. However, if the images show illegal activities that may have serious impacts on wildlife or that jeopardize visitor safety, they may be used for enforcement purposes.
