







## How do I get there?

Trips start in Inuvik, Northwest Territories.

### **DRIVE**

- Drive from Whitehorse or Dawson City to Inuvik via the Dempster Highway
- Plan a side trip up the Inuvik-Tuktoyuktuk
  Highway to see the Pingo Canadian Landmark

## **FLY**

- Canadian North and Air North fly to Inuvik
- Overnight in Whitehorse, Edmonton or Yellowknife





## What can I expect?

## FLYING INTO THE PARK

- Fly in a Twin Otter for 75 minutes
- Admire the tangled channels of the Mackenzie Delta and followed by stunning views of the British Mountains

## **DELAYS**

- Weather delays can occur
- In the event of a weather delay, Parks Canada staff will suggest activities around Inuvik



## **IVVAVIK BASE CAMP** Settle into one of the most comfortable camps in the Arctic. Each day, enjoy fully catered meals by your Inuvialuit Cook. Hike along century-old paths, completely untouched by glaciers. Listen to stories from your Inuvialuit Cultural Host as you admire the rich landscapes of their ancestors. Enjoy the backcountry luxuries of flush toilets and five minute hot showers. Recharge your camera with our modest solar panel system. At the end of the day, tuck into your sleeping bag in our furnished prospector tents.

# When should I visit?

## **EARLY JUNE**

- Greater opportunities to view wildlife
- Visible aufeis in the river
- Moderate bugs

## MID-JUNE

- Wildflowers in bloom
- Visible aufeis in the river
- More bugs

## LATE JUNE TO EARLY JULY

- Vibrant valley colours.
- Clear green-blue colour in the Firth River
- Herschel Island excursion options available
- Many bugs, but the breezes help



What will the weather be like?

Averaging roughly 14  $^{\circ}$ C, the temperature usually ranges between 5  $^{\circ}$ C and 25  $^{\circ}$ C during Ivvavik Base Camp trips. Since weather conditions can change quickly, bring layers and extra clothing.

Don't forget about the 24-hour sunlight! Consider bringing an eye mask to aid with sleep.

## **CATERED TRIPS**

We handle the logistics, you enjoy the trip! All meals and snacks will be provided to you by our local Inuvialuit Cook. Guests are welcome to bring personal food and beverages, as long as they fall within the luggage weight limits and are kept in bear-safe storage.

## Visit Herschel Island-Qikiqtaruk Territorial Park

Add a two-hour stopover to visit a former whaling station at the historic ghost town of Herschel Island – Qikiqtaruk Territorial Park and learn about the traditional Inuvialuit presence here (weather permitting).

## **INDEPENDENT TRIPS**

Prepare your own meals in the camp kitchen, hike independently, and enjoy all of the amenities Ivvavik Base Camp has to offer. Parks Canada staff and an Inuvialuit Cultural Host are on-site to provide stories of the land, manage the facilities, and answer any questions you have.
