GEOMATICS TECHNICIAN

This position supports Parks Canada's Western Arctic operations by providing geomatics services such as mapping, spatial analysis, and data management for various programs. It involves both office-based GIS work and extensive summer fieldwork in remote national parks, including helping plan multi-day trips. This role is may also include emergency response support through a duty officer program.

Work Location: Inuvik, NT

Term: Approximately September 2026 – March 2027 – 6 months with possibility of extension

Annual Salary: \$71,741 - \$90,184 (salary under review)

PLUS an additional approximately \$35,029 (employee with dependants) or \$21,056 (single employee) in applicable Isolated Post Allowances

Who can apply: Persons who have a legal status to work in Canada.

In accordance with the Inuvialuit Final Agreement within the Inuvialuit Settlement Region, hiring preference will be given to qualified Inuvialuit.

Therefore, applicants are encouraged to self-identify in their application.

- Experience creating high-quality cartographic products, such as maps and charts for reports, presentations and public use using GIS (ESRI ArcGIS), as well as word processing, spreadsheet and database programs (e.g. MS Office)
