THE RHYTHM OF THE PRAIRIES

Experience the open Prairies in this 7-day itinerary. Travel back in time and see what life was like in the 19th century. Relax as you stargaze in a Dark-Sky Preserve. Discover beautiful wildflowers and some of the rarest wildlife in Canada.

7 DAYS Depart from Regina, SK → 1 310 km round trip

HISTORIC ROOTS TO HIKING BOOTS

Discover the magic of Manitoba by immersing yourself in the fascinating world of the fur trade, meeting trappers and traders, and kicking back to relax in nature. This journey offers a perfect balance of cultural discovery and natural beauty.

RIDING MOUNTAIN RETREAT

Spend 5 days exploring Riding Mountain National Park, which offers incredible biking and hiking trails, lake adventures, wildlife safaris, and beach time. Cap off the trip with a scenic drive to a bison enclosure, where you can witness prairie wildlife in their natural habitat.

BISON BINGE

Treat yourself to a 2-day getaway in Saskatchewan focused on bison and Métis history. Help Métis settlers with their daily tasks and learn about the Sturgeon River plains bison herd. Perfect for history buffs and wildlife enthusiasts, this short trip blends culture and nature seamlessly.



THE CHALLENGE

How can we protect the Greater Sage-Grouse in Grasslands National Park? Loss of native prairie ecosystem and human development are fragmenting the grasslands. These changes affect the birds' ability to move safely across its habitat, and they create additional perching and nesting spots for predators.

A STEP IN THE RIGHT DIRECTION

In collaboration with our partners, we are clearing away the clutter and connecting wildlife habitats. This involves planting sagebrush and native plants to restore former farmland, burying power lines, removing and marking fences, dismantling decommissioned buildings, and installing perch deterrents.

THE RESULT

Over 818 hectares of habitat have been improved or restored, 135 km of fences have been removed or made safer, 13 decommissioned buildings have been removed, and 13 km of power lines have been buried. Local partnerships also continue to help preserve diverse pastures around the park.

SENSES OF THE STONE FORT

Each season brings a fresh array of colours, smells and sounds to **Lower Fort Garry National Historic Site**. In summer, I hear the clanging of the blacksmith's hammer on the anvil and smell of beef tallow as fresh candles are made. The crunch of red and brown fall leaves at Gabeshiwin. The smell of wood smoke and the squeaking of the slide bolt lock on the Bastion door in winter leads to the ice cracking on the river as the spring ice jams make their way to the lake; then the cycle begins again.





GENERATIONS OF MEMORIES

A tourist attraction in the centre of our city, **The Forks National Historic Site** continues to be a meeting place for all. Its peaceful landscape, events, and ties to First Nations and Red River Métis culture remind me of childhood when I first visited the site. My countless memories of ice skating, tire d'érable (making maple taffy in the snow) and faithful connection to people and history make The Forks such a warm and comforting place.



BEYOND THE BOUNDARIES OF BOUNDARY BOG

Boundary Bog in **Prince Albert National Park** is the trail that made me feel at home. The moss and lichen, the stunted black spruce – it invites you to slow down and take in your surroundings. My family has been on this land since time immemorial, and I am grateful to continue that connection. My favourite sight is muskeg tea plants blooming in spring, white flowers attracting pollinators.


