Gulf of Georgia Cannery National Historic Site

- Immerse yourself in the interactive displays and exhibits and discover the stories of Canada's West Coast fishing industry. Then, commemorate your visit with a stop at the Cannery Store and find fashion, home accessories, toys, and locally sourced, canned goods.
- Experience the charm and community of the picturesque fishing village of Steveston with local boutiques, bakeries, coffee shops, restaurants, and panoramic strolls along the waterfront.
- Explore Steveston Harbour, Canada's largest commercial fishing harbour located outside of the Cannery. Then, visit Fisherman's Wharf where fresh seafood is sold right off the boats.



FEATURED STORY

THE CHALLENGE

How do we protect the keystone Whitebark and Limber Pine, at risk of extinction, in mountain ecosystems? They are threatened by white pine blister rust, a devastating invasive fungus.

A STEP IN THE RIGHT DIRECTION

Seven national parks in Alberta and BC are working together to save the species. Parks Canada and partners collect seeds from trees that appear rust-resistant and send them to tree nurseries. Seedlings are then planted back in the national parks.

THE RESULT

As of 2023, over 79 000 Whitebark Pine and 15 000 Limber Pine seedlings were planted. They are the beginnings of blister rust resistant forests which will provide food and shelter for wildlife, stabilize slopes, hold onto the snowpack, and help prevent flooding.





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
